## Message from the Principal

### Welcome to Term 2

### ANZAC Assembly

In honour of all the servicemen and women who have represented our country in times of war and conflict, we will be holding our ANZAC assembly tomorrow in the undercover area at 2pm. Parents and families are most welcome to attend and to join us and our visiting guests for afternoon tea in the staff room immediately after the assembly. A request was sent home earlier this week for donations of flowers and greenery for floral tributes. It would be most appreciated if you could please bring these in tomorrow morning and take them directly to your child's classroom. Students who belong to clubs such as Scouts, Cubs, St John Ambulance etc are invited to wear these uniforms to the assembly.

### NAPLAN

A reminder that our Year 3 and 5 students will be undertaking NAPLAN testing in Week 3 this term. Tests will be administered in paper form and not via online testing due to the decision to the Minister for Education to delay the commencement of NAPLAN Online. All NAPLAN tests will take place in the morning sessions of the school day. Please ensure that your child arrives to school on time to ensure that testing is not disrupted by late-comers and to give your child the best chance of completing the tests to the best of their ability. To support your child in the lead up to the tests, please ensure that set homework tasks and nightly reading is completed and simply urge them to try their best and to attempt all questions. Please remember that these are not pass or fail tests. They are purely a general assessment of literacy and numeracy and provide a snap shot of student performance **at the time** of testing. If you have any queries regarding the Minister's decision, please contact the school for further information.

### Summer Carnival

Congratulations to all the students who participated at the Interschool Summer Carnival on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March. All the teams promoted the school positively and demonstrated excellent skill and sportsmanship throughout the competition. Thank you to those parents who came to support our teams. ### Change of Student Details

If you have changed address, phone number or any detail relating to your child's enrolment, please advise our office staff. It is essential that we keep our records up to date so that we are able to contact you in relation to your child or in case of an emergency.

### Custody Issues

It is the responsibility of the school to provide education and care for all students enrolled. If there are any changes in family circumstances which may impact on the children, the school should be notified immediately. However, unless there is a court order that states otherwise, each parent has equal legal responsibility for their children and the school is unable to alter details or communication/access arrangements. There are strict guidelines that the school is required to follow in these situations and school staff are unable to become involved in these matters. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to advise the school of any issues and provide copies of relevant, up to date documents. The school should also be advised if there is a change in arrangements for collecting children or if contacts require updating, even if these changes are temporary.

## Social Media and the School Community

The internet and social media provide great opportunities for us to network and stay in touch online. While these technologies can offer a positive space for sharing information and ideas, they also have the potential to cause harm to individuals, groups or even whole communities.

Just as you would discourage your child from acting inappropriately online, it's important to remember that sometimes, negative comments posted about a school community by parents or caregivers can have a bigger impact than expected. Reputations of staff, schools, and even parents can be damaged.

Whenever you're online, you are potentially speaking to an unlimited audience, even if you think your conversations are private. Taking a few moments to think about the content you post could save upset, embarrassment - and even possible legal action or police involvement.

Parental and community feedback is important for schools. If you have a concern, complaint or enquiry about an issue at school, the best approach is to speak directly to us, rather than discussing it in a public forum. If you are worried about online content involving the school community, contact the principal. If you are posting online, remember that your comments help build and support the school community. Make sure you're honest, respectful, considerate - and a good role model for your children.
